Typing Online in Nuxbaśu

The accents in Nuxbaśu can also be written as cz (ć), dz (ç), gh (ǵ), nj (ń), ng (ŋ), rl (ř), sz (ś) and rz (ź) for applications where you can't use the accents

Adjectives in Nuḡbaśu

Adjectives come after the noun that it's describing, e.g. endizu holudx (yellow banana)

To make a pronoun an adjective, replace the -u ending with -uḡ, e.g.

boku (I) → bokuḡ (my)

nu (Us) → nuḡ (our)

sinu (Singular you) → sinuḡ (your)

onaru (plural they) → onaruḡ (plural their)

Adjectives as Verbs

Adjectives can act as verbs when you don't want to say "miěće", e.g.

cihnagin ka?

(Are you ill?)

Plural in Nuḵbaśu

Plural nouns and adjectives end with j, e.g. pomuj
lalxj (red apples)

Possessive in Nuḵbaśu

The ending “-es” shows possession of an item and works just like an adjective, so the word with “-es” goes after the noun it describes, e.g.

pejaću Erikes
(Erik's onion)

Combining words in Nuḡbaśu

When combining words, the adjective goes first, e.g.

balodobu → dobu baloḡ (nice day)

If you are combining a pronoun adjective to a noun, keep the “-x” ending, e.g.

onaruxbusu → busu onaruḡ (their bus)

Accusative in Nuḡbaśu (1)

Object nouns and adjectives end with n, e.g.

Mogalam dudun śadxn. (I drink white milk)

Or:

Hebal had pejaćujn. (We have 6 onions)

To make a pronoun an object, simply replace -u with -un at the end of the word, e.g.

Kabilen igun (We ate it)

Locative case in Nuḡbaśu

The locative case can be used to describe where somebody is going, e.g.

Iralam bazaryn

(I am going to the shops)

Here, the locative ending is -yn and replaces the noun ending -u.

Questions in Nuḫbaśu (1)

Yes/no questions are denoted by the word “ka”, e.g.

kabagin y mulapicun ka?

(Are you eating a pizza?)

The word “kiḫ” can be also be used in an expression, e.g.

kiḫ garabaru! (What a mess!)

Questions in Nuḅbaśu (2)

Refer to the question words in page 6

kiēm atiü muljas?

Atiü muljas san juruj.

(How much does that cost?)

(That costs three euros.)

“magu” in Nuxbaśu – Reflexive pronoun

The reflexive pronoun is used to describe the subject of a sentence, e.g.

Erik iras xd huganu magux̃.

(Erik is going to his house)

However, if we don't use the reflexive pronoun, this would suggest that Erik isn't going to his house, but somebody else's, e.g.

Erik iras xd huganu tarux̃.

(Erik is going to somebody else's house)

NOTE: This can only be used to replace 3rd person pronouns

“enu” in Nuḫbašu – Exclusive “we”

The exclusive “we” is used when you are not talking about the listener, e.g.

~~(Enu)~~ hebalen san pomujn.

(We have 3 apples, but you don't)

“Nu” is used when you are talking about the listener, e.g.

~~(Nu)~~ kabal y pejaćun.

(We are eating an onion)

Suffixes and Prepositions in Nuḫbaśu

Suffixes and prepositions in Nuḫbaśu can be their own word as shown here:

iśx – trash, low-quality

balox – nice

biḫ – inner

Suffixes can even be used together to make new words, e.g.

unbriḫ – unworthy

Prepositions that end with “h” have to have a “j” before a word ending, e.g.

hxh → hxhjx

txsxh → txsxhjx

“da”, “hejn” “na” in Nuġbašu

“da” and “na” are used in a sentence to emphasise a point,
e.g.

Da hebalam pec citronujn
(I do have 5 lemons)

Na hebalam san pejaċujn
(I don't have 3 onions)

Hebalam hejn pomujn
(I don't have apples) or (I have no apples)

Vocative case in Nuḡbaśu

Normally, names end in -u like nouns. To use the vocative case in Nuḡbaśu put an -ë after the name, e.g.

Jonuë! (same as saying Hey, John!)

To make this apply to plural nouns, put an -ën after the noun, e.g.

Heraujën (Ladies and gentlemen...)

“There is/are” in Nuḡbaśu

To say “there is/are” in Nuḡbaśu, say “miėćas”,
e.g.

Miėćas at pomuj.

(There are 8 apples)

“It’s...” in Nuḗbaśu

To say “it’s” (not referring obviously to anything) in Nuḗbaśu, say “miėćas”, e.g.

Miėćas mokujobu 24 dubenu.

(It’s Thursday 3 April)

Numbers in Nuḡbaśu (1)

Ordinal = +x. ejlx, getx = first, second...

Adverb = +o. ejlo, geto = firstly, secondly...

Noun = +u. dośgedu, dośuj, haddośseptiliöngetcentgetdośseptiliönu = a dozen, tens, Avogadro's constant.

Multiple = +obl+x. getoblx, sanoblx = double, triple.

Fraction = +on+u. getonu, jononu = half, quarter.

Group = +op+u. getopu, sanopu = duo, trio

Flexible sentences in Nuĥbaŝu

Nuĥbaŝu, like Esperanto, is very flexible with its sentence structure, e.g.

Mogalam ĝolun

Ĝolun mogalam

(I drink water)

na...lis in Nuḫbaśu

This is like saying (not)...anymore in English, e.g

Na hebalam igun lis

Comparative and superlative in Nux̣baśu

To say a comparative adjective in Nux̣baśu, say
moj.../unmoj..., e.g.

Tiü miēcás moj mugavx od atiu

Atiü miēcás unmoj mugavx od tiu

To say a superlative adjective in Nux̣baśu, say
saj.../unsaj..., e.g

Tiü miēcás pomu e saj mugavx

“Oç” in Nuxbaśu

To say “here is...” in Nuxbaśu, say “Oç” without the word “miēcās”, e.g.

Oç get pomuj (Here are 2 apples)

vasniṣ in Nuṣbaśu

To say “my own”, “your own”, “our own”, etc., say vasniṣ, e.g.

Tiü miēcās anidigu bokuṣ vasniṣ.
(This is my own invention)

“a” and “seme” in Nuḫbaśu

You have to say “a” in a sentence to say “that” as a conjunction, e.g.

Kangaälam, a atiü estas utledu mugavx.
(I think that that is a good idea)

To say “that” as “which”, say “seme”, e.g.

Hebalam y pejaćun seme miěćas lalx.
(I have an onion which is red)

“še” in Nuḫbaśu

“še” is used like the French word “chez” or the Dutch word “bij”. This word is like saying “at somebody’s place”, e.g.

Miëćalam še Erik.

(I am at Erik’s place)
